<u>Full circuit</u>: Much of this walk will be enjoyed by those who like trees, especially the extended Wealdway section in the early stages. The view from the viewpoint at Direction 12 is worth the very short detour. And the start and finish of the walk at West Peckham offers all that a visitor could wish for in an English village: church, friendly pub, and village green incorporating cricket field.

The short detours near Offham cater, first for those who wish to visit Offham Church, and, second, for those who, having done so, nevertheless wish to maintain the continuity of the spine route (see 'Introductory Notes').

Roads and hindrances:

The route crosses the A20 twice. At the first crossing (Direction 40) sightlines are excellent – with central refuge - and at the second (48) they are manageable. The main road at Offham (66) presents no special difficulties. Seven Mile Lane (85) can be busy, but again it is easy to see what is going on. The handful of other roads involved are generally quiet.

The current obstruction at 74 is no more than a nuisance; and the rough and generally unwelcoming track down through the trees in 86 does not amount to a significant problem.

In developing the route I was met, after turning off Aldon Lane at Direction 54, by a number of noisy, fierce-looking but kennelled dogs; and I was glad they were not loose. But then I was greeted by one which was! The dog let me go along my intended path, but escorted me away noisily and rather worryingly. Probably a case of bark-worse-than-bite. (There was no bite.) I shall in time revisit the scene to try to establish whether this was an isolated instance, so if dogs with attitude are a concern to you, look out for updates. Meanwhile I have added, in the appendix, an alternative route which avoids that place. It is only a few minutes longer, but sadly goes for a while alongside the busy and unlovely A20 and misses out a pretty stretch through gardens and fruit trees.

FOR THOSE WHO WALK WITH THEIR DOGS

I do not venture to give advice about walking with your dog. As well as the joys, you will be well aware of the issues involved, and particularly that relationships between dogs and other countryside animals potentially involve mutual suspicion, or worse.

But what this footnote does try to do, in response to requests, is to give some indication of the nature of the walk from a dog's point of view, to enable you to decide whether it is suitable.

The percentage distances on the right should be self-explanatory.

The information in the middle column may look a bit cluttered, but I think it should enable you (if the detail is of interest) to mark up within a few minutes a print-out of the walk notes, so that you have some idea what might be round the next corner.

The risk in all this is that <u>things change so quickly</u> in the agricultural working world; and what I describe might become misleading after subsequent changes. I have done my best, but there is no guarantee that you will find the information up to date!

STILES (3) – Details noted in June and July 2015, but subject to frequent change:

The stile at Direction 52 has climbs of 1 ft. and 2 ft. The gaps between are narrow (no more than 6 ins.)

The other stiles (at 55 and 68) have easy gaps.

At some times of year you are asked to keep your dog on a lead for nearly a mile (Directions 68-70), because of game-birds being reared.
