


# LOCAL CIRCUIT BR1: HORSMONDEN

### Linked churches:

Brenchley (start and finish) Horsmonden (Direction 41)

This route is longer than usual for a Local Circuit. It exists primarily to provide such a circuit for Horsmonden Church, which is exceptional (though not unique) in the distance it is away from any other churches in the diocese. Brenchley is the nearest: nearly 6 miles return even for the flying crow. The 8 miles described here could actually be shortened, but in reality only slightly; and any such shortening would, as far as I can see, provide a somewhat less enjoyable route.

#### **Roads and hindrances:**

The second half of the walk is tarmac-heavy, but those roads are in pleasant surroundings and I have found them to be very quiet. The busy Brenchley-to-Horsmonden road and the B2162 (twice) need crossing with a bit of care but without undue difficulty.

## FOR THOSE WHO WALK WITH THEIR DOGS

I do not venture to give advice about walking with your dog. As well as the joys, you will be well aware of the issues involved, and particularly that relationships between dogs and other countryside animals potentially involve mutual suspicion, or worse.

# But what this footnote does try to do, in response to requests, is to give some indication of the nature of the walk from a dog's point of view, to enable you to decide whether it is suitable.

The percentage distances on the right should be self-explanatory.

The information in the middle column may look a bit cluttered, but I think it should enable you (if the detail is of interest) to mark up within a few minutes a print-out of the walk notes, so that you have some idea what might be round the next corner.

The risk in all this is that **things change so quickly** in the agricultural working world; and what I describe might become misleading after subsequent changes. I have done my best, but there is no guarantee that you will find the information up to date!
