



## MATFIELD CIRCUIT

### Churches in the shorter circuit:

Brenchley (start and finish) Paddock Wood (Direction 34)

The spine sections in the Brenchley and Matfield sectors have been severely shortened to enable Horsmonden Church to be included in a Full Circuit. This Shorter Circuit covers both those spine sections, and is therefore included in both Brenchley and Matfield sectors. Though appearing separately under both headings, these two Shorter Circuits are identical.

#### Associated local circuits

• MF1: Matfield – Brenchley - Matfield

**Shorter circuit**: Alternating between High Weald and Low Weald, there are some delightful stretches (such as the northward view around Direction 14, and the rolling landscapes around 66).

#### **Roads and hindrances:**

There are routine crossings of fairly busy roads: Maidstone Road (twice – Directions 13 and 33), Badsell Road (30) and the junction by the John Brunt VC (36), but in each case the sightlines are good and ordinary care will be enough. There is a brief brush with Pearson's Green Road (55-56), which is no busier but needs to be crossed a couple of times to deal with the right-hand bend.

Queen Street and Willow Lane (50-54) form an extended (half-hour or so) section on roads, which will not please those averse to tarmac; but I have always found them to be very quiet and – Willow Lane particularly – pleasant. (The railway bridge (54) looks worrying in prospect, but the alert walker will find it quite manageable.)

### <u>SHORTER CIRCUIT</u> Brenchley – Matfield North - Paddock Wood - Brenchley

The start and finish is at **Brenchley Church** (TN12 7NH)

## FOR THOSE WHO WALK WITH THEIR DOGS

I do not venture to give advice about walking with your dog. As well as the joys, you will be well aware of the issues involved, and particularly that relationships between dogs and other countryside animals potentially involve mutual suspicion, or worse.

# But what this footnote does try to do, in response to requests, is to give some indication of the nature of the walk from a dog's point of view, to enable you to decide whether it is suitable.

The percentage distances on the right (on the next page) should be self-explanatory.

The information in the middle column may look a bit cluttered, but I think it should enable you (if the detail is of interest) to mark up within a few minutes a print-out of the walk notes, so that you have some idea what might be round the next corner.

The risk in all this is that **things change so quickly** in the agricultural working world; and what I describe might become misleading after subsequent changes. I have done my best, but there is no guarantee that you will find the information up to date!

## STILES (4) – Details noted in April 2016, but subject to frequent change:

The three stiles encountered in quick succession in Directions 47-49 are all wired down (though the second of them, in 48, currently has a big gap below it). The rises are, roughly:

in 47 - 18 ins. and 2 ft. in 48 (a double stile) - 1ft., 1ft. and 2 ft. in 49 - 18 ins. and 18 ins.

The stile in 62 has easy gaps.
