COXHEATH CIRCUIT

Churches in the full circuit:

Linton (start and finish) Hunton (Direction 34) East Farleigh (78) Coxheath (Direction 91B: Detour - see Appendix)

Associated local circuits

- CX1: Linton Hunton Coxheath Linton
- NY3: Hunton Yalding
- NY2: East Farleigh Barming Teston

<u>Full circuit</u>: Much of the route is in countryside which is unremarkable but perfectly enjoyable. The return to the Greensand Way towards the end provides some pleasant views.

Roads and hindrances:

The main road at Linton (start and finish) needs to be treated with normal main-road care (though, if starting from another point on the circuit and choosing not to visit Linton Church itself, it is not necessary to cross the road). Other places where heightened care is called for are Vicarage Road (Directions 43-44), Smith's Hill (53) and Ewell Lane (61), and the crossing of Dean Street (86). And when joining the roads in Directions 61 and 72 the proximity of the roads might be an unwelcome surprise.

If the undergrowth in Direction 9 is as dense as I found it, locating the track and footbridge will be a cause for congratulation; but the unofficial alternative the other side of the hedge is perfectly viable, with an easy fence-climb at the end to return to the route at Direction 10.

FOR THOSE WHO WALK WITH THEIR DOGS

I do not venture to give advice about walking with your dog. As well as the joys, you will be well aware of the issues involved, and particularly that relationships between dogs and other countryside animals potentially involve mutual suspicion, or worse.

But what this footnote does try to do, in response to requests, is to give some indication of the nature of the walk from a dog's point of view, to enable you to decide whether it is suitable.

The percentage distances on the right should be self-explanatory.

The information in the middle column may look a bit cluttered, but I think it should enable you (if the detail is of interest) to mark up within a few minutes a print-out of the walk notes, so that you have some idea what might be round the next corner.

The risk in all this is that **things change so quickly** in the agricultural working world; and what I describe might become misleading after subsequent changes. I have done my best, but there is no guarantee that you will find the information up to date!

STILES – See the next page

STILES (14) – Details noted in July 2016, but **subject to frequent change**:

The stile in Direction 7 is wired down and has two rises of about 18 ins. each but there are currently huge holes alongside.

The one in Direction 10 is also wired down and tall, with rises of about 18 ins. and 2 ft.

The old stile in 12 has easy gaps, and the one in 29 has a dog gate.

The one in 32 is a double stile, with rises of about 18 ins., 6ins. and 18 ins.

Most of the remaining stiles have easy gaps (the pair in 42, and those in 43, 46, 59, 60).

But the one in 56 is a double-stile, wired down, with rises of about 12, 6 and 18 ins.; the one in 57 (wired down double-stile, rises of about 12, 12 and 18 ins.) is a bit delapidated and might perhaps offer a dog some space to clamber through at the side; and the one in 61 (also delapidated) is wired down with rises of about 6 and 12 ins.
