

Roads and hindrances:

Though there are many roads, none should cause undue concern, given ordinary care.

The start and finish is at **Rochester St Justus Church** (ME1 2QQ).

1		From the steps leading from St Justus Church , turn left down	744 662	
		The Fairway.		
2	2	At the junction at the bottom turn sharp right and then cross		
		the road as soon as is convenient.		
3	3	Turn left up Hawser Road.		
4	5	At the top turn left to go briefly along the main road and cross	741 663	
		it by means of the traffic island.		
5	6	[Map point] Turn right along Valley View Road.		
6	11	Go with the road as it swings right, and then left.	737 664	
7	13	Carry on ahead, crossing the end of Secretan Road.		
8	18	At the T-junction at the end turn right along Hill Road.		0.93
9	19	Turn left down Cookham Hill.		
10	21	At the bottom turn left alongside the main road, but keeping		
		above it on the raised access road.		
11	24	Go down with this road to meet the main road, and cross it.		
		Borstal Church is a few yards along on the left. To continue		
		the route turn sharp right to go along the left-hand side of the		
		main road.		
12	27	Turn left down Shorts Way.		1.35
13	30	Swing right at the bottom and follow the footway, winding at		
		first, and then following the river along the Esplanade.		
14	44	[Map point] Stay alongside the river as the path forks left, away		2.21
		from the road. After the end of the houses, follow it as it bends		
		to the right and emerges at the corner of an open space.		
15	48	From this corner walk on a gradual diagonal to join the road on		
		the right: aim at the right-hand end of the distant trees - the		
		point where they reach the road. (Before long the castle also		
		appears, showing, by chance, the exact line.)		
16	51	Reach the road and cross to go ahead along its right-hand side.		
17	52	[Map point] Turn right up Baker's Walk.		
18	53	Swing right, as the paved walkway joins from the left.

19	54	Follow on leftwards at the top of Baker's Walk.		
20		At the junction at the end, turn right, along St Margaret's Street		
21	55	Pass the Coopers Arms on the right.		
22	60	Reach the lych-gate, the entrance to St Margaret's Church .		
23	61	Turn left into Watts Avenue.		
24	64	At the end go over the crossing road, and more or less straight ahead along the 'no through road' roadway.		
25	65	At its dead end go ahead along an enclosed walkway.		
26		At the end turn right along the road, following it as it swings to the left.		3.25
27	67	Just before the shops on the right, turn right up the roadway, and, after crossing another one, start up a narrow passageway opposite, passing briefly under the houses.	743 678	
28	68	Cross another road, and continue ahead along a similar alley.		
29		When finally confronted by a wall, turn left to go parallel to the road above.		
30	69	[Map point] Take the first opportunity to turn right up a similar passage.		
31	70	Reaching one more road (Castle Avenue), turn left along it.		
32	73	At the T-junction at the bottom turn right along Delce Road.	746 676	
33	74	Pass the driveway leading to <u>St Peter's Church</u> .		
34	76	Turn right along Cecil Road.		
35	77	Turn second-left along Catherine Street.		
36	81	At the crossroads continue ahead along Weller Avenue.		
37	83	Turn right, alongside the Co-op, and follow the road as it bends to the left.		4.13
38	85	Marling Way becomes The Tideway. Continue ahead.		
39	88	Turn left into Crest Road, steeply uphill.		
40	89	Turn right up Windward Road.		
41	92	Pass the end of Leeward Road, and continue ahead, uphill.		
42	93	At the junction with the major road (The Fairway), St Justus <u>Church</u> , the starting point of the walk, is visible over the road and slightly to the right.	744 662	4.63

FOR THOSE WHO WALK WITH THEIR DOGS

I do not venture to give advice about walking with your dog. As well as the joys, you will be well aware of the issues involved, and particularly that relationships between dogs and other countryside animals potentially involve mutual suspicion, or worse.

But what this footnote does try to do, in response to requests, is to give some indication of the nature of the walk from a dog's point of view, to enable you to decide whether it is suitable.

The percentage distances on the right should be self-explanatory.

The information in the middle column may look a bit cluttered, but I think it should enable you (if the detail is of interest) to mark up within a few minutes a print-out of the walk notes, so that you have some idea what might be round the next corner.

The risk in all this is that **things change so quickly** in the agricultural working world; and what I describe might become misleading after subsequent changes. I have done my best, but there is no guarantee that you will find the information up to date!
