

LOCAL CIRCUIT GS2: PARKWOOD AND TWYDALL - 6.11 miles

Linked churches:

Parkwood (start and finish)

Rainham (Direction 15)

Twydall - Holy Trinity (33)

Wigmore (44)

Roads and hindrances:

Hardly a hindrance, but the crossing of the A2 and roundabouts in Direction 36 could be a navigational challenge as well as taking a little extra time!

The start and finish is at Parkwood Church (ME8 9PN).

1		At the end of Parkwood Centre's main access road, with	809 643	
		Parkwood Church on your right, turn right along the main		
		road (Long Catlis Road).		
2	1	At the end of Long Catlis Road turn left along Deanwood		
		Drive, crossing it as soon as possible.		
3	2 [Map point] Leave the road by turning right throu			
		kissing gate into the trees of Foxburrow Wood.		
4 Af		After 30 yds. take the left fork and follow the broad path,		
		gently downhill.		
5	5	Fork left again, quite steeply downhill at first.		
6	6	At the bottom merge right into another path.		
7		Reaching the road, turn left, uphill; then right at the top.	811 646	
8	8	Swing left, uphill again, ignoring Barleycorn Drive on the right.		
9	9	Turn right into Lonsdale Drive, and cross when convenient.

16	27	In order to reach Station Road on the right, use the light-		
		controlled crossing just beyond it to get over the A2. Then

25	39	In the course of the right-hand bend, turn off to the left along The Willows.		
26	40	At the far right-hand corner of this cul-de-sac, turn half-right on a path between walls.

		The ultimate objective is to continue, beyond the crossing of the A2, along the same southward direction as the original approach from Twydall Lane, along Courteney Road which starts from the approach road to Tesco's and runs parallel to, and on the left of, the A278, as it heads south towards Wigmore. The various road crossings to reach Courteney Road are all easily manageable, with care, but might require a little patience.		
37	76	When Courteney Road reaches the next roundabout, stay on the left-hand side and go clockwise round it, crossing a second approach road to Tesco's and another one leading to the garden centre. Then continue along the left-hand side of Courteney Road, past the Delphi Technologies premises on the left.	797 663	3.80
38	87	After gentle left and right bends, ignore the roundabout over to the right, and continue on the left-hand side of what has now become Hoath Lane.

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FOR THOSE WHO WALK WITH THEIR DOGS

I do not venture to give advice about walking with your dog. As well as the joys, you will be well aware of the issues involved, and particularly that relationships between dogs and other countryside animals potentially involve mutual suspicion, or worse.

But what this footnote does try to do, in response to requests, is to give some indication of the nature of the walk from a dog's point of view, to enable you to decide whether it is suitable.

The percentage distances on the right (on the next page) should be self-explanatory.

The information in the middle column may look a bit cluttered, but I think it should enable you (if the detail is of interest) to mark up within a few minutes a print-out of the walk notes, so that you have some idea what might be round the next corner.

The risk in all this is that **things change so quickly** in the agricultural working world; and what I describe might become misleading after subsequent changes. I have done my best, but there is no guarantee that you will find the information up to date!

The high percentage shown below for 'busy road' is possibly misleading for those walking without dogs. Much of this walk is on or beside roads which are too busy to allow, for instance, for dogs to be let off the lead; and hence 'busy road' in this context. But for the most part they are tranquil enough for human purposes!
