

LOCAL CIRCUIT DA2: SWANSCOMBE AND GREENHITHE - 6.20 miles

Linked churches:

Swanscombe (start and finish)

Stone (Direction 38)

Greenhithe (47)

Roads and hindrances:

Crossing the few main roads (Directions 6, 32, 45, 47) is not difficult with usual care.

At Direction 13 there is a more direct OS-mapped footpath, but even in a dry summer it is impossibly flooded. The road alternative is much used. There are 'No right of way' notices at each end of this road section directed at anyone thinking of staying on it further, beyond this short length, implying that use of the section itself is accepted in practice.

The stretches alongside the Thames (Directions 15-21) have alternatives.

15-16: There are actually three parallel options: the line written up here, nearest to the river (and potentially in it if the water is exceptionally high!); the embankment up on its left, which gives the best view of the river, but gets increasingly rough underfoot; and if all else fails the roadway further to the left. All lead to the same place (the start of 17, where the new buildings of Greenhithe Village begin).

17-21: The riverside walk should not be a problem, but an 'inland' alternative is given in the Appendix just in case. (From 18 onwards there is also a parallel walkway up above the riverside walk.)

The climb of Breakneck Hill (49) is steep but not very long.

The path down from Spring Vale (52 – unsignposted and easily missed!) is quite narrow and currently overgrown in places: tiresome rather than a real problem!

The start and finish is at **Swanscombe Church** (Swanscombe Street, DA10 0BD).

1		From the entrance to Swanscombe Church , turn right along	605 740	
		Swanscombe Street.		
2	2	After crossing the road when convenient, turn left along Church Road.		
3	5	Continue ahead, ignoring Herbert Road on the right.		
4	8	At the end go ahead, using the island to cross the road, and continuing, after a slight right-left turn, along the left-hand side of the High Street.		
5	11	Pass the entrance to Swanscombe Station opposite, and go on towards the traffic lights ahead.		
6	12	Use the lights to cross, first to the right, and then the main road (A226 - now on the left.)

7	13	On the far side of the main road, turn left for a few yards, then		0.67
		right to start along a short, rough roadway, more or less		
		continuing the original direction of the High Street. This soon		
		continues ahead to become an enclosed tarmac path.		
8	17	Cross a minor roadway and then a more substantial road.		
9	18	On the other side, go ahead through a squeeze gate and take		
		the left fork.		
10	19	Take the obvious course, slightly left over a tarmac area, then		
		right along its far edge		
11	20	Follow the path along the right-hand side of a green wire fence.		
12	21	At the end, go straight on (not following the main path as it	602 754	
		swings to the left) down a much narrower pathway. (DS12 -		
		very flooded!)		
13	24	Emerge through a squeeze gate and turn right along the		1.21
		roadway. Continue along it, ignoring the footpath which forks		
		off to the left (which would be the preferred route if it were not		
		permanently under water!).		
14	25	Take the left fork.		
15	28	[Map point] Follow the roadway as it doubles back on itself,		
		leftwards, and then, for the sake of the view over the river,		
		walk along the start of the raised embankment which follows		
		its curve. The greenness of the surface is deceptive, as there are		
		rough stones beneath.		
16	30	To avoid the worst of the stones, abandon the embankment at a		
		signpost to go carefully down to the right, to the parallel path		
		just above the river level.		
		See above. If, exceptionally, the river is so high as to be problematic,		
		it is possible to continue, with care, along the embankment, or to cut		
		back across to it from the riverside path (but the terrain does not allow		
		this everywhere – just at occasional individual places).		
17	38	[Map point] Reaching the very end, step up to the left to reach		1.91
		the start of riverside walkway and then turn to walk through a		
		metal gate and on again alongside the river's edge.		
		[And here, if, again exceptionally, the water level is discouraging, see		
		the alternative route written in the Appendix.]		
18	43	Where the walkway bends briefly to the left, go more or less	592 753	
		straight ahead over the grass, and then on the path next to the	0,2,00	
		river, as before.		
10	40	[As an alternative there is a parallel walkway up to the left.]		
19	49	At the far end turn half-left alongside the children's		
		playground. Then follow the path slightly rightwards, to		
20	=0	emerge at a road next to the Pier Hotel.		
20	50	Turn half-right along the road (Arethusa Place, leading to High		
21	= 4	Street).		
21	54	At the end swing left with the road (now Station Road).

22	55	[Map point] Just after the end of Eagles Road opposite, turn right at the end of the modern building, initially down an unpromising paved entry (signposted for Hibernia Court), which soon opens out and turns right, then left, around a square dominated by ASDA, leaving its café on the left on the		
		far side. Then leave the square at the corner and continue ahead.		
23	58	At the end go straight ahead along a narrow footpath with fences on both sides (and currently construction works over on the right).		
24	60	At the far end cross what is currently a site access road, and carry on to go briefly along the right-hand side of the main road.		2.87
25	61	Turn right, away from the road, along the signposted footpath. Where the path reaches the river and turns left, follow it, but (if it is not too muddy) along the top of the embankment which rises parallel to it on its left.	581 750	
26	66	[Map point] Turn left, down steps, off the embankment and away from the river, just beyond the point at which another set of steps leads across from the main riverside path. Then, at the bottom, continue ahead along an enclosed pathway.		
27	68	Continue ahead through a MKG and a barrier formed by concrete slabs, and walk alongside a metal fence on the right and a roadway on the left.		
28	70	At the end of the fencing, as the road bends slightly to the left, instead leave it by turning right, at a waymark, through a wooden kissing gate and along a footpath with a lake on your left.		
29	71	Swing left with the path.		
30	72	Move across to the right, through a gap, to join an access road leading to a roundabout at the main road.	576 751	
31	73	Turn right to go alongside the main road toward the light-controlled crossing.		
32	74	Cross to the left-hand side using the crossing and continue alongside the road away from the roundabout.		
33	75	[Map point] Leave the road by way of a gap on the left, signposted for Stone Crossing Station.		
34		Turn left along the roadway.		3.61
35	76	When the road turns left, instead go ahead a few yards further and then turn left up the steps and cross the railway over the footbridge.		
36	77	Coming down from the bridge, turn left up the road, passing the Lads of the Village opposite.		
37	79	Turn left on to Church Road, and follow it as it bends slightly left to start with.		
38	81	Turn left down a footpath at the entrance to Stone Church .		
39	82	Cross a road and continue straight across to cross the railway over a footbridge.		
40		Immediately after the footbridge, turn right, parallel to the railway.

42	89	Go ahead over a bridge, and down the other side.		
43	90	At the bottom turn right to go under the railway bridge, then		
		swing left along the roadway.		
44	92	Turn left towards the traffic lights and the main road.		
45	93	Reaching the dual carriageway, use the light-controlled		
		crossing to go across.		
46		Once across, turn right, not immediately along the dual		
		carriageway, but parallel to it along Ivy Villas.		
47	96	[Map point] At the end follow the road round to the left, to the		4.56
		light-controlled crossing. Use it to cross the road. The entrance		
		to Greenhithe Church is a few yards further on the left, but to		
		continue on the route, instead turn right on the far side.		
48		Without going as far as the dual carriageway ahead, turn left at		
		the corner of the Railway Tavern / McDonald's to go along the		
		access road.		
49	98	Take the left fork up Breakneck Hill.	586 746	
50	100	At the top merge right into the road (Mounts Road).		
51	105	Just after the brow of the hill, turn left along a walkway above		
		and parallel to Knockhall Road. Then, opposite house no.23,		
		use the steps to go down to the road itself, and along it.		
52	108	[Map point] Soon after Spring Vale on the right, and about 15		
		yds. before the next road, turn right along a long, narrow		
		passageway, currently somewhat overgrown at first, which		
		soon bends left and then right.		
53	112	Keep left, ignoring the track on the right.		
54	116	After a couple of kissing gates, reach the road at the end, and		5.49
		turn left up the walkway which runs parallel to it.		
55	119	At the top cross Gilbert Close and carry on ahead, alongside		
F (the road itself.		
56	122	Approaching a mini-roundabout, turn left (Milton Street).		
57	123	At the next mini-roundabout turn right (Alamein Road).		
58	124	Cut the corner leftwards to make a left turn (Trebble Road).		
59	125	Turn right along Gunn Road.		
60	130	After walking alongside Swanscombe Park, pass the gate at its

61		At the junction, swing left with the road as it becomes

The inland alternative to Directions 17-21

17A		About 100 yds. before the end, approaching the new residential		
		colony, instead of going ahead towards riverside railings, turn		
		left, up past the end of main embankment and over the		
		roadway to reach a squeeze gate concealed behind a concrete		
		slab.		
17B	1	Go through the squeeze gate and then follow the path as it		
		bends slightly to the right.		
17C	2	Approaching the estate road at the end, surprisingly take the		
		right fork, which curls round further to the right and leads to a		
		gap in the fence enclosing the grass. Go through the gap to the		
		roadside, cross the road and head along the long, straight road		
		which starts here (from a point slightly further to the left), first		
		passing the bus stop.		
17D	3	Continue ahead along the right-hand pavement, passing the		
		'Stonely Crescent' sign on the right.		
		(It may be appealing along this long road to cross over to the		
		grass on the left-hand side, which will not be a problem,		
		though at the end you will have to cross back.)		
17E	5	At the first roundabout cross Portland Place and continue		
		ahead.		
17F		Pass the Ingress Abbey bus stop, and continue ahead.		
17G	7	At the second roundabout cross Lighterman's Way and		
		continue ahead.		
17H		With the imposing façade of the abbey up to the left, pass the		
		end of The Boulevard on the right.		
17I	10	Pass Waterman's Way on the right and continue up ahead. (If		
		walking on on the left, the grass ends here: cross back to right.)		
17J		At house no.33, where the road bends to the left, instead		
		continue straight on along the tarmac path signposted for		
		Meriel Walk.		
17K	12	Go straight across the road which comes down from left to		
		right, and walk along the passageway ahead.		
17L		Go through a metal kissing gate.		
17M	13	At the end turn left along the road, then after about 40 yds.		
		right along Eagles Road.		
17N	19	At the end briefly turn left along the main road, rejoining the		
		main route, and then turn right as at Direction 22.		
		Add 2 minutes to subsequent total times and 0.08 miles to		
		cumulative distances.

FOR THOSE WHO WALK WITH THEIR DOGS

I do not venture to give advice about walking with your dog. As well as the joys, you will be well aware of the issues involved, and particularly that relationships between dogs and other countryside animals potentially involve mutual suspicion, or worse.

But what this footnote does try to do, in response to requests, is to give some indication of the nature of the walk from a dog's point of view, to enable you to decide whether it is suitable.

The percentage distances on the right should be self-explanatory.

The information in the middle column may look a bit cluttered, but I think it should enable you (if the detail is of interest) to mark up within a few minutes a print-out of the walk notes, so that you have some idea what might be round the next corner.

The risk in all this is that <u>things change so quickly</u> in the agricultural working world; and what I describe might become misleading after subsequent changes. I have done my best, but there is no guarantee that you will find the information up to date!
