Psalms 118 v 1-2, 14-24

Colossians 3 v 1-4 or Acts 10 v 34-43

A prayer to say together

Dear God,

Thank you for the story of Easter and the empty tomb. Thank you that your plan did not end with death on the cross but with your resurrection and new life.

Thank you that you made a way for us to be forgiven for all our mistakes and to be your friends forever.

We pray today for all those in the world who do not yet know you, that they would draw closer to you this Easter.

Discussion

A question for adults to ask children

How did Mary know that the person she met was Jesus?

Mary did not realise at first who Jesus was, the Bible tells us that she thought he was the gardener. It was only when Jesus called her by name that she recognised him. This is the sort of relationship that God wants with each one of us – God knows each of us by name and loves us like a shepherd loves his sheep. Just like the sheep know the voice of their shepherd God wants us to respond to him and follow Him.

When he died and rose again Jesus removed all the barriers that stood between us and God, all our mistakes were wiped away, the price was paid. Because of Jesus we can choose to follow God and to enjoy a perfect relationship with Him.

A question for children to ask adults

Who is your best friend? What is your favourite thing about being friends with them?

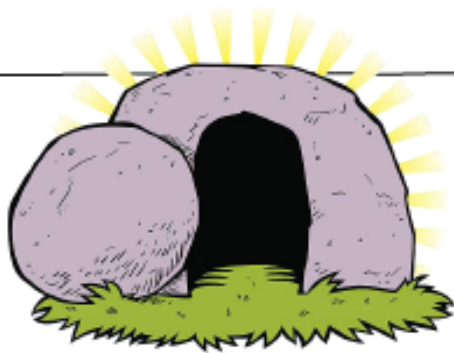
Family Activity 1

You will need: A blindfold (scarf)

Mary recognised Jesus when he called her name. Play a game together – take it in turns to wear a blindfold. Members of your family should say your name but should try to disguise their voice, can you still recognise who they are?

If you are feeling brave why not see if the person in the blindfold can be guided round the house just by following a voice calling their name.





A verse to remember

Matthew 28 v 6

"He is not here; he has risen!"

Try to learn this verse together, you could come up with some actions to help you remember it or decorate the verse on a piece of paper or card together and put it up somewhere to remind you of it through the week. You could shout it out loud as a celebration of the Easter story and Jesus' sacrifice for us!

Family Activity 2

You will need: Anything you have around the house

Gather items from your home, garden or from your daily walk to create your own Easter Garden together.

You will need to select a stone to be in front of the tomb and roll away, a flowerpot or cup can make a good substitute for the tomb. You could do some junk modelling and use some items from your recycling or just build the whole thing from building blocks and toys.

Once you have built your Easter garden, use any toy figures you have to act out the story of Easter morning together.



Active Prayer

Write on some pieces of paper the names of friends or family members that don't yet know Jesus as their friend and Saviour.

Take a few pieces each and hide them around the house, then go on an "Easter prayer hunt" – each time a name is found take a moment to pray together for that person that they would come to know Jesus.



What about the eggs?

Did you know that the first 'Easter eggs' were eggs from ducks or hens painted or dyed in bright colours?

Here are some ways that Easter Eggs point back to Jesus...

Traditional Easter Eggs are hollow, the empty space inside reminds us of the empty tomb after Jesus had risen from the dead.

It's great fun to search for hidden Easter Eggs around your house and garden – as we search we can remember Mary and Jesus' other friends who searched for him and were surprised to find the tomb empty.

Eggs are a symbol of new life, they remind us of the new life that is available to all of us through Jesus.

Seeking Jesus this Easter Sunday

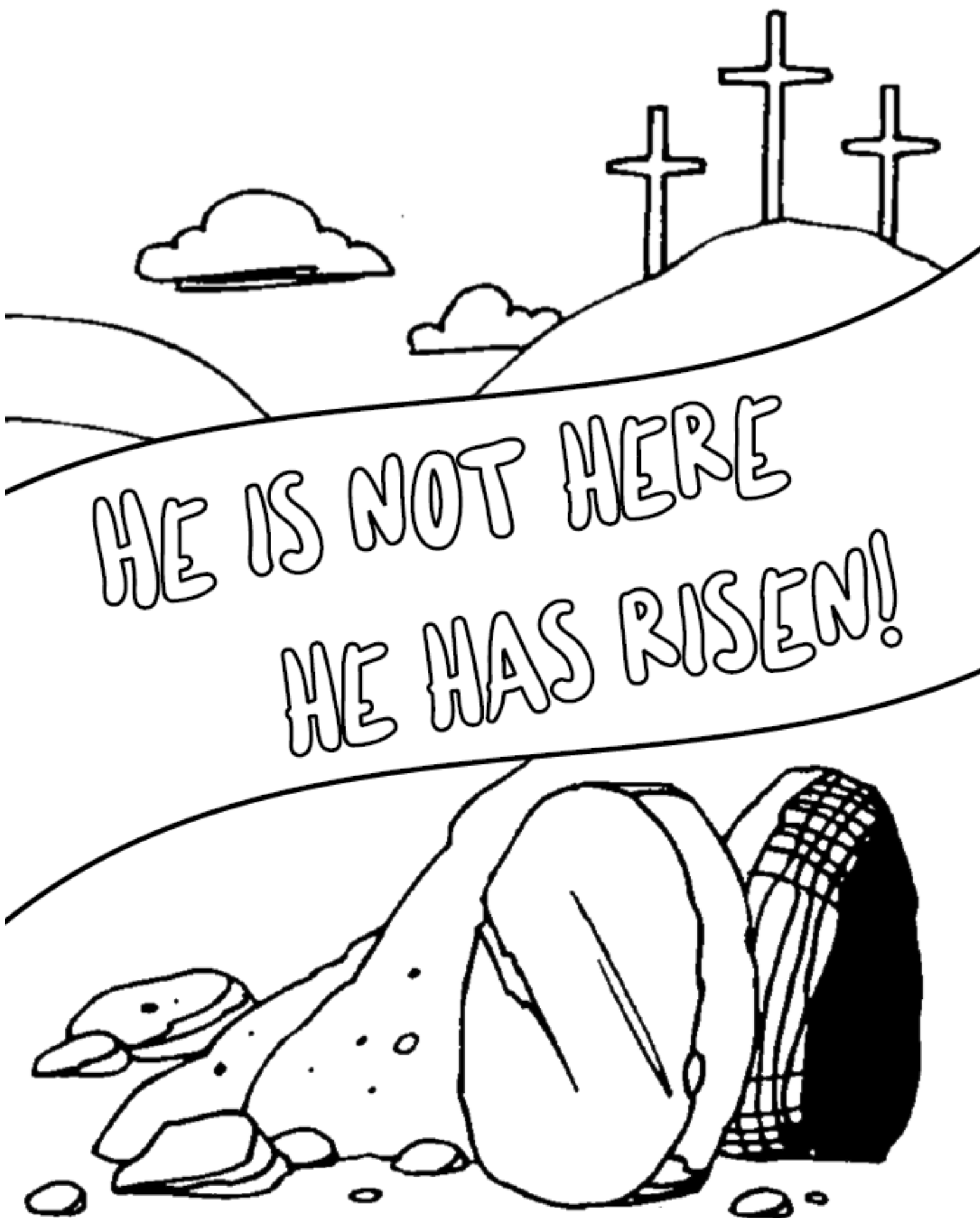
If you have never prayed a prayer of commitment asking Jesus to be your Saviour here is a simple prayer you can say today.
