

## APCM 2025

The 2025 Annual Parochial Church Meeting is on Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> May, after the 10:00am service in the church. It will start with a short meeting of parishioners to elect two churchwardens for the coming year. Churchwardens are vital for the church if it is to continue as a viable Christian witness in our area. For the past few years we have only had one churchwarden, Ian Nurdin, who has done all he can to keep the church functioning properly, but the efficient running of the church really needs two people to share the load and cover the inevitable absences for holidays etc.

This meeting will be followed by the APCM which will include elections of people to serve on the Parochial Church Council and to represent the church on Deanery Synod (who will also become a PCC member).

All registered local government electors in the parish are entitled to take part in the meeting of parishioners as well as people living elsewhere who are on the Ash church electoral roll. Everyone is welcome to attend the APCM and all those who are on the church electoral roll may vote on the issues raised. Do put the date in your diaries and consider, prayerfully, whether you are able to offer yourself to help the church to meet its obligations to our community and the wider church. Please contact me for a nomination form for any of the positions if you would like to help to guide the church in its mission to our community.

In addition to the elected positions, we are also looking for someone to take over the task of Parish Safeguarding Officer. The PCC hope to make this appointment after the APCM so any willing volunteers will be gratefully accepted. Please speak to Ian Nurdin if you would like to find out what is involved.

It is clear that the treasurer's role is particularly busy over the autumn so we are looking for someone new, a secretary, to carry out some of her tasks especially writing thank-you letters to everyone who sends in money.

We are also looking for a new treasurer. Susan has been doing a wonderful job for the past five years, but her home responsibilities with her elderly mother mean that she has less time than she had, and she has decided now is the time to stop. She is not disappearing however and both she and Jane Bird, the Friends of Kent Churches' treasurer will be able to provide lots of support.

Attached are two job descriptions outlining the roles and the sort of skills that would be useful for the roles. Please do circulate to anyone who you think might be a good fit and we would love to hear from them to talk it through. Susan (<u>kentrideandstridetreasurer@qmail.com</u>) is the best person to explain what she does and either she or I can talk about what we might think a secretary would do. As it's a new role there is flexibility about how much the secretary might do but we hope he or she would enjoy getting fully involved with the committee business.

Finally, I would also add that we are investigating how our website could be used to streamline some of our administration, which will be a great new development.

Opportunities to get involved with the organisation of Kent Ride and Stride

#### Can you consider taking on a Secretarial role? Home based role.

This is a new role we are setting up to support the Treasurer with preparing and sending thank you letters to the fund raising churches, mainly during the period mid September to early January. These would be of a standard mail merge format but may need some individualisation in relation to any queries regarding changes noted in contact details. About 350 of the returns raise money and require thanks. Currently, individual letters are pdf'd from the mail merge and emailed out.

Additionally, the new Secretary's role could include some or all of the following tasks, depending upon circumstances:

- Taking minutes at Committee meetings (5-6 a year) and meetings with AO's (twice a year)
- Supplying each of the 50 AO's with contact details of the LO's in their area twice a year. The information is readily extracted for the master spreadsheet
- Updating sponsorship forms and other paperwork for church packs after discussion and agreement with Committee members at spring meeting
- Printing out labels for the church packs (July)
- Collating the requests for new boards and banners working alongside Vice Chairman

A good working knowledge of spreadsheets and word processing is needed but not an advanced level and there is plenty of support from the friendly committee members.

#### Background

As many of you will know our current Treasurer, Susan Hooper, is also very committed to full time care of her 99 year old mother and, after 5 enjoyable years as Treasurer, finds it is time to pass on the Ride and Stride Treasurer role as her other commitments increase.

This has given the committee the opportunity to review the roles of those on the committee and we feel that as well as a new Treasurer, we need a Secretary to work alongside and support our new Treasurer and the other officers.

At present we have a small committee of 6 members who all contribute to the running of the annual sponsored event raising money for the Friends of Kent Churches (FoKC).

The website is currently under review to streamline some of our administration – both for the committee and for participating churches/Local Organisers - so it is an exciting time to join the team.
